Selected Scholars for this highly competitive program receive complimentary registration and travel support to attend <u>The Liver Meeting</u>, where they will participate in exclusive networking and educational events while also having full access to all scientific programming the meeting has to offer. During their award year, Scholars will also receive complimentary AASLD membership, subscriptions to AASLD journals, and be able to participate in special virtual professional development activities led by AASLD / AASLD Foundation leadership.

Selection Criteria:

Candidates will be evaluated on their potential for a career in academic hepatology including their background and professional potential, scholarly activities and research productivity, and demonstration of motivation, self-direction, and personal integrity.

Individuals who practice in underserved communities or identify as part of a systemically marginalized group in medicine that has historically faced barriers due to factors such as their race, ethnicity, gender expression,

sexual orientation, disability, or socioeconomic status (e.g., first generation college graduate, from low-income communities, etc.) are strongly encouraged to apply. For more information, please see:

To promote health equity, increase patient access in medically underserved communities, and support increased diversity in the hepatology workforce, each year a minimum of 30% of available awards will be reserved for applicants who are practicing in federally designated health professional shortage areas, employed at Minority-Serving Institutions (MSI) for groups underrepresented in medicine, or who identify as a member of a group underrepresented in medicine.

Applications will be reviewed based on the written materials submitted. **Incomplete applications and applications that fail to adhere strictly to the instructions (including the submission deadline and page limitations) will not be reviewed.** All decisions are final.

Eligibility:

In order to be eligible for this award, the applicant must adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1. Applicant Requirements
 - The applicant must be in an Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Med-Peds, Pathology, Radiology, or Surgery residency program in the US, Canada, or Mexico. The eligibility window for each residency type is listed in the table below.

- They must be interested in choosing adult or pediatric gastroenterology, hepatology, hepatopathology, surgery or GI radiology with an emphasis on hepatobiliary imaging as their career focus.
- Have a mentor who is active in hepatology and who is an AASLD member in good standing.
- Candidates do not need to be an AASLD Member to apply for this program.
- Previous participants of the Emerging Liver Scholar program are not eligible to apply again. Previous applicants who were not selected are encouraged to re-apply if they continue to meet eligibility criteria.
- 2. Mentor & Application Requirements
 - The mentor must be active in hepatology and be an AASLD member in good standing.
 - Each Mentor may support up to two applicants per year.
 - Two mentors may act as co-mentors for one ELS applicant, if appropriate.
 - There is no limit to the number of applications that will be accepted per institution, but only one candidate may be selected per distinct residency program at a single institution (i.e., one resident from the internal medicine program and one from the pediatric program at the same institution may be selected, but two internal medicine residents at the same institution will not be selected in the same program year, even if they are in different PG years).

Participation Requirements:

The Emerging Liver Scholar program combines a fully sponsored trip to The Liver Meeting and ongoing virtual engagement and development activities to help participants explore a career in hepatology.

During their one-year award term, Emerging Liver Scholars will be required to participate in the following activities:

1. Conferences and Events

- The Liver Meeting 2024 Emerging Liver Scholars will receive a fully sponsored trip to attend The Liver Meeting in person, including rail/airfare/mileage, 5 nights lodging, registration, and a stipend for meals/incidentals.
- Virtual Meetings Regular virtual meetings will be held throughout the year on various topics within hepatology.

2. Mentoring

- Ongoing Mentor Meetings Participants will be expected to meet independently with their program mentor regularly throughout the program year.
- Participants will work with their mentor to identify a proposed schedule for The Liver Meeting to maximize learning activities related to their specific areas of interest.

Awardees are expected to remain active participants in all activities throughout their award. If an awardee has not met minimum participant expectations, it could impact future availability of funding for the awardee or their residency program.

Reporting Requirements:

All reports to be provided by the recipient for this award shall be in writing and acceptable to the Foundation as to the type of content and format. Failure by the recipient to provide final progress reports could jeopardize the recipient's future eligibility for other Foundation funding programs.

Recipients of named awards of distinction may be further required to attend a virtual introductory meeting with donor representatives for their award to present information on their background, research interests, and career goals.

Recipients will be responsible for promptly responding to requests from the Foundation for updates on their accomplishments and participate in all efforts to track outcomes associated with this funding, including responding to annual post-award impact update surveys for up to five years following completion of their award.

Recipients must also provide the Foundation with a digital copy of any published report of research sponsored in part or in full by the Foundation within one year of publication.

Other Program Details:

- 1. Awards are made to the individual and not their institution. Awards cannot be transferred to another individual at the same institution.
- 2. Awardees are expected to attend The Liver Meeting in-person during their award year.
 - AASLD Foundation will be directly responsible for registration, housing, and travel costs.
 - Awardees will receive a stipend of \$375 to defray costs for meals not provided during the meeting and other incidental expenses.

- Awardees unable to attend The Liver Meeting in-person due to an extenuating circumstance (e.g., illness, personal emergency, or other unforeseen or unavoidable reason outside of their control) may request deferment of travel support for one year. Requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and approval is at the discretion of AASLD Foundation. All decisions are final. Awardee noncompliance with AASLD Meeting Attendee or Health and Safety Rules and Polices (and, if AASLD's Meeting Rules and Policies allow for exemptions, failure or inability to submit necessary documentation for an applicable exemption), negligence to plan to attend, or inability to secure leave on the meeting dates are not considered extenuating circumstances.
- 3. Awardees are expected to remain active participants in program activities throughout their award. If an awardee has not met minimum participant expectations, as outlined in this RFA, it may impact future availability of funding for the awardee or their residency program.
